# 'CREATING SAFER SPACE' Foundation Safeguarding Training

If you are new to a role as a worker with children and young people, a pastoral visitor, a local preacher/worship leader, a representative on your church council or a church safeguarding coordinator, you may not have attended Foundation Safeguarding training. **YOU MUST ATTEND THIS COURSE!** The Government states that ALL volunteers should have safeguarding training every 5 years.

There will be a Foundation Safeguarding Course on:

#### Saturday 2 December, 9.30am – 1pm Hucclecote Methodist Church

By the end of the module you should:

- Understand that safeguarding and creating safer space is everyone's responsibility and an integral part of being church.
- Have a better understanding of the safeguarding processes within the Methodist Church and your role within them.
- Know when to have concerns about the safety and welfare of a child or vulnerable adult.
- Recognise potential blocks within the church to responding well.
- Be able to respond appropriately to concerns about the safety and welfare of a child or vulnerable adult using the Methodist Church policies.
- Recognise that there are experts within the Church to help you respond to concerns, and be able to identify who is the expert in your church
