Ekklesia

In this edition of the Public Issues and Social Responsibility Bulletin we want to draw your attention to the work of Ekklesia.

Ekklesia is a Christian think tank which focuses upon social, political and economic justice from a faith (and occasionally non-faith) perspective. The organisation has taken a particular interest in studying the impact of welfare reforms and reflecting upon the ethics of those reforms from a faith perspective. For example, this week, Ekklesia has produced a briefing on the impact of "holiday hunger" upon children from poor families during the summer holidays. It refers to the letter written by church leaders and campaigners and recently published in the Daily Telegraph which argues that the Government should safeguard children's nutrition for the full 52 weeks a year, rather than only the 39 weeks in which they are at school (www.ekklesia.co.uk/node/24295).

Ekklesia is a useful resource for anyone wanting to learn more about the background to a whole range of public issues and social justice concerns - and can help to provide solid research and background data for any individual or church that is seeking to campaign on a social justice issue. Sadly, their material is only really accessible via the internet - at <u>www.ekklesia.co.uk</u>.
