The Harvest Festival Celebration Event will be held in the Cloister and Cloister Garth of Gloucester Cathedral, admission is free. A special Thanksgiving Service will follow at 3pm in the Cathedral Nave. This year's theme will be 'Thinking Green' and will showcase ways we can all be a little bit greener. It is almost one year since the Cathedral installed solar panels on the Nave roof and visitors will have the chance to learn more about how these help the Cathedral work towards a greener future, as well as taking a step back in time with activities such as grinding corn, making herb remedies to willow weaving. There will also be information on the importance of bees to the environment and how we can all help them thrive, upcycled art activities plus music performed by a local community choir to raise awareness of water use and water aid.
