Just a reminder that the Circuit Archivists need the following for deposit at the Gloucester Archives:

- Minute Books for Church Council and all local church organisations (7 years after the last entry)
- Baptism registers and Sunday School attendance registers
- Notice Books
- Church magazines
- programmes for special events
- papers relating to property schemes

Please, however, no cheque book stubs, bank statements or bills!

I am compiling a list (from receipts given over the years by the Gloucester Archives) for each church and each circuit, past and present, within the present Methodist Circuit of Gloucestershire of items available for inspection at Gloucester, together with their reference numbers. This should be of value to anybody wanting to write a history of their local church, and to Circuit Ministers who might be asked for a copy of a Baptism certificate, for instance. There are thousands of items and well over 100 churches, so this is still a work in progress, but I think the lists are now sufficiently advanced to be of use. Please contact me if you are interested in seeing any of the lists.
