3rd January 2020 Covenant Sunday

This short act of worship has been prepared for you to use while you are unable to attend worship in a church building. Why not spend a few moments with God, knowing that other people are sharing this act of worship with you. This service has been prepared for the first Sunday in the year in which Methodist normally hold Covenant Services. In many places that is not possible, but we will think about the Covenant prayer in anticipation of the time when the services can be held.

Call to Worship: Jeremiah 31.33-34

This is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the LORD," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love.



Time to Reflect

The image of the vine is about togetherness. That is one of the reasons why the passage is apt for the Covenant Service.

Jesus begins by talking about the role of the vine grower, who tends the vine with purpose to make it produce as much fruit as possible. That includes the skill of careful pruning. Jesus likens this to the work "the Father."

Jesus then uses the image of the interconnected vine that bears fruit to describe our relationship with him. If we are to be fruitful, we have stay connected to Jesus because it is through staying together with Jesus that we grow.

We are given a sense of the Father working in the Son and both working together in the lives of disciples. It is important to notice that Jesus is not talking to individuals but to the community of disciples. It is in being together that the Christian community is fruitful.

As he develops the theme Jesus shifts the focus from the vine to the idea of "abiding." Fruitfulness comes from living in and staying in a committed relationship with God and with each other that is based on love. In the Covenant prayer that Methodists use every year we are reminded of the fundamentals of our "togetherness" as Christians. God, through Jesus, takes the initiative and invites us into a living relationship in which we are offered life, liberation and love. We respond by recentring our lives on Jesus. That is a personal commitment but also something we support each other in by doing it together. We make that commitment for ourselves today aware that others will be doing the same. We look forward to the time when we can be together in one place to renew this covenant relationship.

Today, we choose again to trust God, to walk with Jesus and to live in the ways of the kingdom.

One way of putting this into practice is found in "The Methodist Way of Life." This is a set of commitments and practices that encourage and equip us to live a Christian life better. Before you say the covenant prayer, read through the commitments and reflect on which of these you want to grow in during the coming year.

As far as we are able, with God's help:

Worship

We will pray daily. We will worship with others regularly. We will look and listen for God in Scripture, and the world.

Learning and Caring

We will care for ourselves and those around us. We will learn more about our faith. We will practise hospitality and generosity.

Service

We will help people in our communities and beyond.

We will care for creation and all God's gifts. We will challenge injustice.

Evangelism

We will speak of the love of God. We will live in a way that draws others to Jesus. We will share our faith with others.
