

WINTER QUARTER PASTORAL LETTER

One starting point for a Christian approach to the climate emergency can be found in the New Testament Letter to the Colossians (1: 15-20.) The writer shatters any illusion that the world was created for our convenience and is ours to use and abuse as we wish. Talking about Christ we read, "all things have been created through him and for him." (v.16.) We then read about God's purpose that is made known in Christ which is "to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross." The message is that the whole of creation is destined to be caught up in God's promised salvation.



For Christians, facing up to the challenge of climate change is not just an option for the enthusiasts nor a distraction from our main purpose. It is how we can join in God's mission in the current age and be part of God's movement for the renewal and reconciliation of all things. For Christians, taking action about climate change is a sign of hope in God's future and a way of making known the gospel of God's reconciling love that encompasses all things.

The fact that global warming is caused by human activity that releases tonnes of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere is beyond dispute. The results are having a devastating effect

already, particularly on those who are most vulnerable. Those who have contributed the least to the emergency are suffering the most. Oxfam points out that droughts and floods are becoming more frequent while growing seasons for crops are more unpredictable. The result is that millions go hungry.

The focus is currently on the COP26 gathering in Glasgow. The success of that gathering will not be shown in grand statements, but in the action that needs to be taken by nations working together as a matter of urgency. We can do things that make a difference in our own lives and as churches. Several of the churches in the Gloucestershire circuit have bronze awards from Eco Church, and some have achieved the silver award. This means that we are making progress to becoming an Eco Circuit. Doing this means making changes that are a stretch, but achievable. The awards programme involves looking at buildings, land, personal lifestyle, engagement with the local and global community and reviewing worship and teaching programmes.

How to use tech to live more sustainably

Lesley Ward, Social and Climate Justice Team, recently attended a webinar titled 'How to use tech to live more sustainably'. Presented by a company called 'Makers' (https://makersacademy.medium.com/about), the presenter was the co-founder of Every One of Us (https://everyoneofus.uk).

A brief overview was given on why it is important to live as sustainably as possible, with ideas ranging from eating less meat, buying locally, eating organically produced food to recycling sustainably, etc.

Ideas included (in terms of lifestyle choices):

- buy less, and buy second hand
- unused electrical items (most of which contain precious minerals) can be sold, given away to be refurbished for further use, or recycled (Currys/PCWorld will recycle any electrical item irrespective of whether it was bought in one of their stores or not).

There were also several tech recommendations that might be helpful. The best website to use to calculate carbon footprint is WWF; GIKI is an app that allows you to scan a supermarket product barcode and it will tell you how sustainable it is; bank.green is a website that allows you to type in your bank provider and it will tell you how 'green' it is. A look at 'Every One Of Us' is recommended.

Diversity and the Church

St Mark's Cheltenham are hosting a Café Church service on Sunday 9 January 2022 at 6.30pm with Revd Rachel Leather and Andy Rickell with the theme of Diversity and the Church.

Andy was one of the leading radical advocates of the disability rights movement for 20 years, including a controversial opinion piece in the Guardian when he criticised the largest disability charities.
